- ▶ Types of compliance
 - ▶ Administrative
 - ▶ Practical
- ▶ Feedback from constructors
 - ▶ The good
 - ▶ What we need to address

...here's some numbers....

- ▶ Numbers of machines checked, around 500
- ▶ 350 Site visits by April 2017
- ▶ Initial compliance around 50%
- ▶ Now compliance is around 90%
- ▶ Constructor awareness from 30% to 80%

Achievements 2016/17

- ▶ Defining the agenda
- ▶ Working with other boroughs
- ▶ Delivering the agenda on the ground
- ▶ Developing staff
- ▶ Training – for other boroughs

focus on the next year

- ▶ Merging and distributing guidance
- ▶ Working with our partner councils to ensure conditions
- ▶ More site visits
- ▶ Gather details of compliant companies to identify needs
- ▶ Work with contractors
- ▶ Continue to feedback to partners

the feeling after a year

- ▶ We're just starting
- ▶ Ironing out the problems
- ▶ Identifying opportunities
- ▶ Developing best practice
- ▶ Missed opportunities and unregistered sites

...final thoughts

- ▶ The overwhelming feeling from staff is there is a desire from the industry.....to do the right thing.....
- ▶ Compliance can be difficult, simply because of the technicalities
- ▶ The outcomes are great.....getting there is painful.....
- ▶ We need to make administrative compliance simple and painless with the focus on emissions.
- ▶ No need for enforcement (yet).....compliance driven through education cooperation and partnership.
- ▶ There is a noticeable change in the industry
